What you will learn

To achieve the certificate, you would need to gain a total of 15 credits. You will need to achieve all the mandatory units and 5 credits from the option units to obtain your qualification. Mandatory Units - Principles of building construction, information and communication, worth 6 credits - Working in construction and building, worth 3 credits - Introduction to environmental sustainability, worth 1 credit Optional units - you will need 5 credits from any of the options below: - Health and safety in the workplace, worth 3 credits - Job seeking skills, worth 3 credits - Employment rights, contracts and pay, worth 3 credits - Employment skills, worth 3 credits - Internet safety for IT Users, worth 3 credits - Building confidence and self-esteem, work 3 credits - Interpersonal skills, worth 3 credits - Introduction to construction and building industries, worth 2 credits - Bullying and harassment in the workplace, worth 1 credit

Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements, however, a reasonable level of literacy is required.

This qualification is assessed by short answer questions and multiple-choice exams.
