Understanding Safeguarding for Work, Education and Life Award level 1

Course Overview

If you are looking to work in an educational setting, such as a school, this course looks at some of the key components of safeguarding, essential for this type of work. It also broadens your knowledge and understanding of some of principle points that are advantageous to any work and life in general. It explores the different types of abuse and how to recognise them as well as safeguarding issues caused by modern technology, what is meant by discrimination and victimization and the importance of disclosing concerns to professionals.

What you will learn

The aim of the course is to: - Know the meaning of safeguarding in work, education and life contexts - Know different types of abuse and their recognition features - Understand the possible safeguarding issues caused by modern technology - Understand the meaning of discrimination and victimisation - Understand the importance of disclosing safeguarding concerns to professionals

How you will be assessed

This qualification is assessed by short answer questions and multiple-choice exams.

Course Fees

You will not be required to pay a fee for this course if you are in the following categories: In receipt of one of the following benefits: Universal Credit, JSA or ESA (Employment and Support Allowance Work Related Action Group) or low waged. Evidence of benefits will be required on the application. Subject to eligibility students will also receive a free lunch.
