Entry Requirements

Entry Level 3 Literacy and Maths

- Eligibility and Requirements - Applicants must be aged 19 or over.
- Candidates must legally reside in the UK.
- You must be in receipt of Universal Credit or ESA.
- All candidates must be able to pass a drugs and alcohol test.
- If you are aged between 19 and 23, you must already hold a full Level 2 qualification to be eligible.

The rail sector has rising demand for new and advanced skills. There are currently high numbers of vacancies in Operations, Signalling Telecoms, Systems Engineering, Traction Rolling Stock and Electrification activities.
